"We are targeting the experienced, working group so our delivery system tends to be related to what they are doing now. We are enhancing it by dealing with the practical and application aspects in class discussions. We bring in examples from current situations.

"Most of our students are already working in their respective industries such as banking, manufacturing, engineering and law, and by coming together they are bringing their ideas and thoughts to be shared and debated. This allows everyone to learn from different perspectives and experiences," he said.

"The benefit of going online is students can learn any time. All the relevant information and knowledge are posted in the system

where students can access before class. We give knowledge in advance so they can do their own research and later discuss it in class."

Juhary feels it is important to have a qualification because it gives you better opportunities and knowledge. "It is different possessing a Masters in comparison to having a Bachelor degree as it (the former) looks at things from the highest level of thinking.
